Quality care for older people a priority in the Illawarra/Shoalhaven

The Illawarra Forum today responded to concerns raised in last night's Four Corners report on Aveo retirement homes.

"Aged care and retirement living in the Illawarra is largely provided by not-for-profit providers" said Illawarra Forum CEO, Nicky Sloan "There are some wonderful local organisations in this region who genuinely seek to provide quality services which support individual choice and rewarding, inspiring lives."

It is important to recognise that the experiences of the people in the report, while clearly distressing, were within the context of a single, profit-making ASX listed commercial provider.

"We encourage older people to do their research in order to make an informed choice when they move into retirement living or aged care" Ms Sloan said "Our local not-for-profit providers exist only to service their clients. They do not have the same imperative to derive a profit to satisfy shareholders. Any profit they make is ploughed straight back into providing more opportunities for their clients."

The Illawarra Forum is strongly supportive of our local not-for-profit organisations who provide services that are affordable, reliable, and innovative.

Our local not-for-profit aged care members invest back into their organisations in order to have highly qualified staff; modern, innovative facilities, and to offer a range of services.

"If the Four Corners report has raised concerns" said Ms Sloan "we encourage people currently living in retirement villages or care facilities, and those who are considering this as their next move, to discuss their concerns with their provider".
